About the award

Supporting the next generation of coagulation specialists

The Prof. Heimburger Award was created in honor of Professor Dr. Norbert Heimburger, a pioneer of modern coagulation therapy who significantly contributed to the understanding and treatment of coagulation disorders during his more than 30 years' service at CSL Behring. In 1981, the world's first effective virus-inactivated FVIII concentrate was introduced, following his crucial work surrounding the development of virus-safe plasma products based on pasteurization.



The Prof. Heimburger Award provides support to successful early career researchers, enabling them to continue vital work within the field of coagulation, thrombosis and acquired bleeding disorders. The award is now entering its 16th year, with an increasing number of international applications and 75 winners of the award so far. Each year, the Scientific Committee independently evaluates all applications to select the five winners.

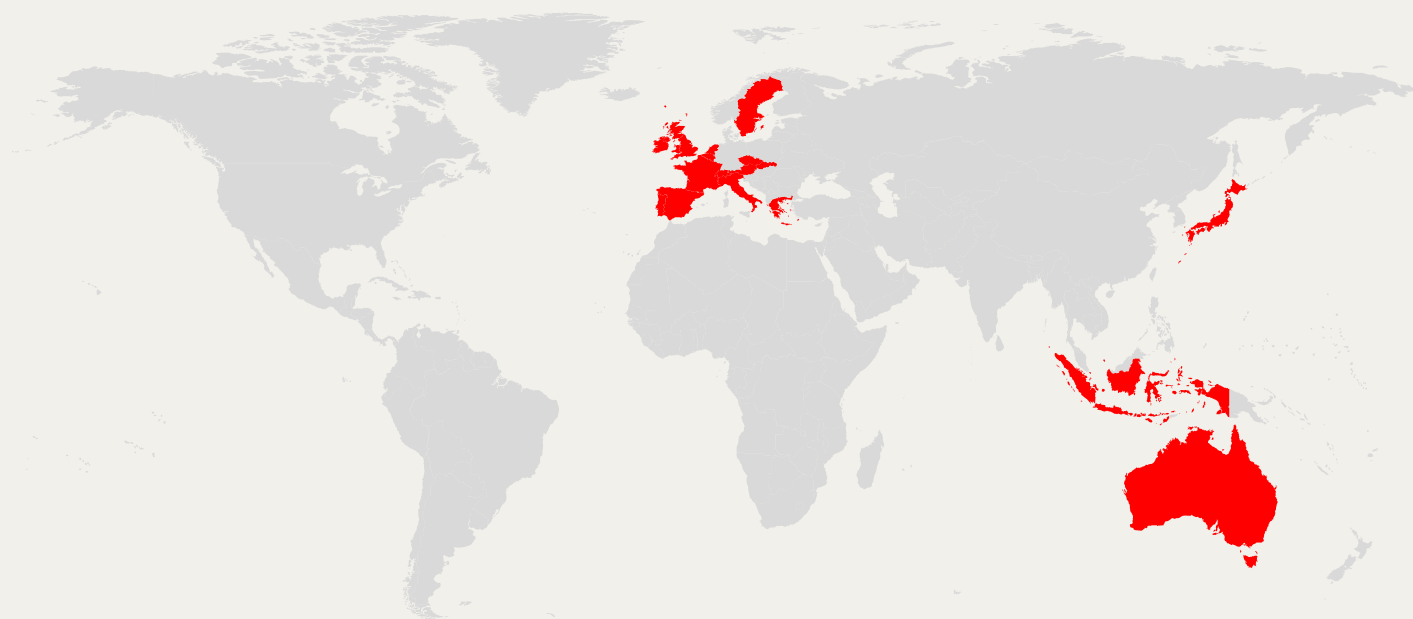

Prof. Heimburger Award Ceremony 2022

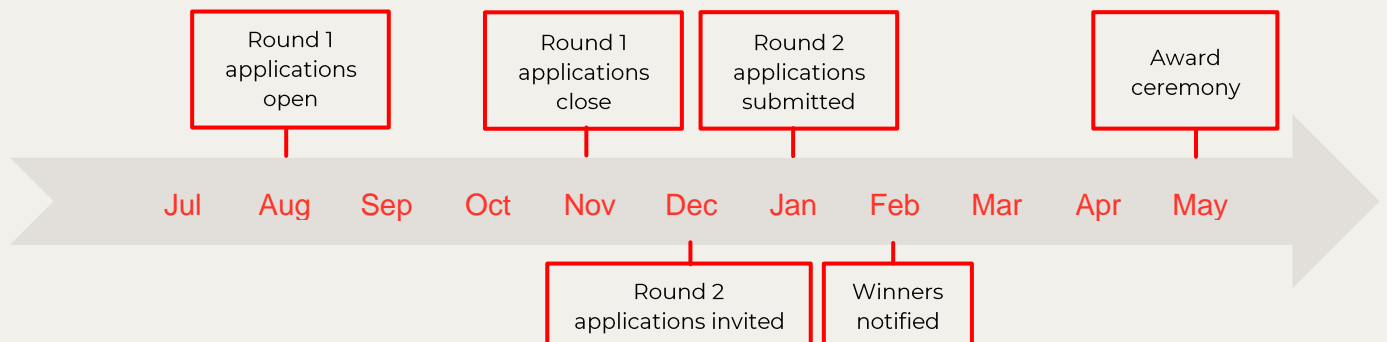

Applying for the Prof. Heimbürger Award 2023

Applications for the Prof. Heimbürger Award 2023 will open on **August 1, 2022**, and the process is simple:

- The first round of applications consists of a one-page research proposal, a short CV and an application form.
- For the second round, 10 successful applicants will be invited to submit a more detailed research proposal.

After evaluation, five winners will be selected and invited to present their proposal at the award ceremony. The evaluation process for both rounds is conducted independently of CSL Behring by the Scientific Committee.



Applying for the Prof. Heimburger Award 2023

Grant details and eligibility

CSL Behring are delighted to announce that from 2022 each global research grant has been increased to €25,000. The Prof Heimburger Award is open to researchers who hold a medical degree or a PhD. Applicants with less than 5 years faculty experience in hemostasis will be preferred.

No matching funding is a prerequisite for this grant. The grants will be available for clinical and/or preclinical research in the area of coagulation, thrombosis and acquired bleeding.

Application procedure
